

Notice of Race



Fastnet Trophy

Schull Community College Sailing Club

4th - 6th April 2025

The Organising Authority (OA) is Schull Community College Sailing Club (SCCSC) in association with Irish Sailing (IS). The hosts are the Fastnet Marine Outdoor Education Centre (FMOEC).

1. Introduction

- 1.1. The Fastnet Trophy will take place on Friday 4th, Saturday 5th April and Sunday 6th April 2025 at Fastnet Marine Outdoor Education Centre, Schull, West Cork, Schull, Ireland, P81X398.
- 1.2. The event is for three boat teams in boats sailed by two people. The boats will be supplied by the OA and will include the TR3.6 dinghy and may also include Firefly type dinghies.

2. Rules

- 2.1. The Event will be governed by the Rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS)* including *Appendix D*.
- 2.2. Races will be umpired. The World Sailing Call Book for Team Racing will apply.
- 2.3. The right of appeal is denied in accordance with RRS 70.3(b)
- 2.4. Rule 40.1 (Personal Floatation Devices) applies at all times while afloat or on any slipway or pontoon.
- 2.5. Each team and competitor agree to abide by Attachment X to this document, Damage Assessment.
- 2.6. The notation [NP] in a rule in this NoR or the Sailing Instructions denotes a rule that shall not be grounds for protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1.
- 2.7. The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

3. Eligibility [NP]

- 3.1. The competitors in a team shall be in full time secondary education, be bona-fide members of the School or Organisation they represent and should not change during the event.
- 3.2. Teams shall consist of
 - a) competitors representing a single School or Organisation
 - b) competitors representing Combined Schools or Organisations from a clearly defined geographical area, or a recognised group of educational institutions
- 3.3. No competitor may represent a combined team and also be a member of a school entered under NoR3.2(a).
- 3.4. No competitor may sail for more than one team.

- 3.5. After an entry has been accepted, the nominated helms or crews shall not be changed without the prior written approval of the race committee.
- 3.6. Where more than one team is entered by a school or organisation, each team shall be identified by a suffix, suffixes shall not be numbers or letters.
- 3.7. All organisations must be accompanied by a designated adult chaperone who is over 18 and must not be sailing in the event.
- 3.8. All organisations are required to make at least one person available who can assist the OA with conducting the regatta, either on or off the water. Organisations that have three or more entered teams are required to make at least two people available.

4. Request for Invitation

- 4.1. Entry to the Event will be by invitation only.
- 4.2. Requests for invitation will be accepted until 1700 on Friday 24th January 2025 by using the form available at <http://events.ksail.co.uk/2025/FastnetTrophy/>

5. Invitation to Enter

- 5.1. From the requests for invitation received, a maximum of 24 entries will initially be invited.
- 5.2. Initial invitations for entry will be issued by 1700 Monday 27th January 2025
- 5.3. Requests for invitation which did not receive an initial invitation will be placed on a waiting list.
- 5.4. Additional entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the OA.
- 5.5. Decisions of the OA about invitation, entry or eligibility shall not be cause for redress. This amends RRS 76.3.

6. Confirmation of Entry

- 6.1. Entries will not be considered valid unless all requirements of this Notice of Race are met.
- 6.2. Teams shall confirm their entry by accepting their invitation by no later than 1700 on 3rd February. Invitations not accepted by this time will be assumed to have been declined and the invitation will be allocated to the next team on the waiting list.
- 6.3. All competitors, under the age of 18, must submit a completed Guardianship Form with their entry form. Any competitor that fails to meet this requirement will be deemed ineligible to race.
- 6.4. On receipt of an acceptance, the OA will issue the organisation an invoice for entry fees due. This invoice will not be cancelled; the team will forfeit their entry fee should the entry subsequently be withdrawn.
- 6.5. Should another team be found to replace the cancelled entry a partial refund of the entry fee may be issued.
- 6.6. By accepting an invitation, the team, and the organisation it represents agree to the damage process as detailed in Attachment X to this Notice of Race.

7. Entry Fees

- 7.1. The entry fee per team is € 600 which will be invoiced on acceptance of an invitation.
- 7.2. Unless expressly agreed by the Organising Authority, the entry fee must be paid no later than Monday 24th February 2025
- 7.3. The Entry fee will be forfeit if a team is withdrawn within one week before the start of the event.

8. Event Schedule

- 8.1. Registration will take place in Fastnet Marine Outdoor Education Centre on Thursday 3rd April between 6.00pm and 7.00pm and between 7.30am and 8.30am on Friday 4th April.
- 8.2. There will be a briefing for competitors and team managers at 9am in Fastnet Marine Outdoor Education Centre with the first warning signal will not be before 10.00am on Friday 4th April.
- 8.3. There will be no warning signal, for any stage other than Knockouts after 16.00pm.
- 8.4. Further details of the event schedule will be published in the Sailing Instructions (SIs) and published on the official noticeboard.

9. Clothing

9.1. All competitors will be required to wear wet suits or dry suits, unless indicated by the race committee on each racing day [DP].

10. Course and Format of Racing

10.1. The course will be described in the Sailing Instructions and will be a “Digital N” configuration.

10.2. The format of the event will be described in the Sailing Instructions.

11. Prizes

11.1. The Fastnet Trophy will be awarded to the overall winners of the event but the trophy will remain with SCCSC.

11.2. Additional Prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.

12. Data Protection, Rights to use Name and Likeness

12.1. The personal information you provide to the OA will be used to facilitate your participation in the event and may be shared with third party organisations; a list of whom may be obtained by contacting the OA. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the OA’s privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

12.2. By participating in this event competitors automatically grant to the OA the right in perpetuity to make use and show at their discretion any photography, audio and video recordings and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue until their final departure, without compensation.

13. Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: “The responsibility for a boat’s decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone”.

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

13.1. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- a) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
- b) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- c) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- d) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the OA does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to the host venue or the event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.

- g) It is their responsibility to ensure that they are familiar with the type of boat used, and the supplied equipment and are suitably experienced with its operation.
- h) It is their responsibility for ensuring all supplied equipment is carried on board.
- i) They are fit to sail and that they believe the crew and the boat and crew is capable of competing in the anticipated conditions.

14. Cancellation

14.1. The OA reserves the right to cancel the event. The entry fee and any deposits will be refunded less any unavoidable costs.

Attachment X –Damage Assessment

It is expected that all competitors show due care and attention to the boats that are provided for their use during the Event. Damage to boats causes conflict, delay and impacts everyone involved at the event. This attachment intends to help minimise damage; ultimately providing more racing at less cost for everyone.

In the unfortunate case of damage occurring, this attachment provides guidance to competitors and officials on how damage may be assessed, penalised and costs allocated as equitably as possible.

X1. DAMAGE AGREEMENT

- X1.1 By entering the event, the team expressly agrees to follow and comply with this system without delay or dispute. A failure to comply with an instruction or invoice issued may result in disqualification from the event without a hearing.
- X1.2 On acceptance of an invitation, a link for paying the damage deposit will be emailed to each team. This deposit will be paid to the hosts, Fastnet Marine Outdoor Education Centre.
- X1.3 Each team is liable for up to € 500 of damage associated costs per incident (this includes boats, equipment and property).
- X1.4 Any decision on the allocation and quantum of any damage associated costs is solely for the OA to determine. Subject to RRS 61, the decision of the OA is final and teams agree to accept it without dispute.

X2. DAMAGE ASSESSMENT

- X2.1 An initial assessment of damage will be made as soon as possible following an incident.
- X2.2 Onward assessment of the damage after further inspection will have no effect on a penalty given in accordance with RRS 14 but may affect any damage associated costs.

X3. DAMAGE ASSOCIATED COSTS

- X3.1 The Race Committee may require a team to make an intermediate payment, to the amount defined in this attachment; against allocated damage costs before the team may sail another event boat.
- X3.2 If a team is allocated damage associated costs, and these are not paid at the event, the OA will issue an invoice to the team. Invoices must be paid (without setoff or deduction) within 14 days unless an extension is agreed with the OA.
- X3.3 Failure to comply with a damage invoice within 14 days (or any extension period) is a breach of this agreement and the OA may:
 - (a) disqualify the team in question without a hearing;
 - (b) reject any future entries from the team's organisation.
- X3.4 The OA may amend or cancel a damage notice at any time and may reinstate a team disqualified.
