The Organising Authority (OA) is Rutland Sailing Club in conjunction with BKL

15-16 February 2025

1. Introduction

- 1.1. •The British Keelboat League is a nationwide competition leading to the Sailing Champions League.
- 1.2. •The British Keelboat League including University KL at Rutland Sailing Club Qualifier will take place between 15th and 16th February 2025 at Rutland Sailing Club, Gibbet Lane, Edith Weston, Rutland, LE15 8HJ.
- 1.3. •This qualifying event forms part of the British Keelboat League Series 2025. The competition is open to Teams or Clubs to compete in qualifying events for invitation to the Universities Series Final.
- 1.4. •The Event will be sailed in RS21 type keelboats supplied by the Organising Authority.
- 1.5. •There will be more Teams than boats at each event with each Team being scheduled to race in a selection of races against as many different Teams as equitably possible.
- 1.6. •Details and entry for other BKL Qualification Events is available via www.britishkeelboatleague.co.uk.
- 1.7. •Details and entry for the BKL Series Final is available via events.ksail.co.uk/2025/BKLFinal/.
- 1.8. • The RYA Racing Charter is in effect and competitors are expected to sail in compliance with it. The Charter can be found at the front of the RYA edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at www.rya.org.uk/racingrules.

2. Rules

- 2.1. •The event will be governed by the Rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and local byelaws.
- 2.2. •Races will be umpired; rule changes can be found in Appendix UF - British Keelboat League Edition.
- 2.3. •RRS 40.1 (Personal Floatation Devices) applies at all times whilst sailing or transferring between boats.

3. Event Details

- 3.3. The Official Race Office will be in the John Merricks Building to the East of the main clubhouse (on the side closest to the main dam)

4. Entry

- 4.1. •The Entry fee shall be £380 per Team. This will include a 3 course meal on Saturday evening at approximately 19.00pm
- 4.2. •Entries and Entry Fee payment should be made using the online entry form available at <https://www.rutlandsailingclub.co.uk/event/blind-sailing-event--11> by no later than 2359 on 11th February 2025.
- 4.3. •A minimum of 5 team entries and a maximum of 10 team entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis.
- 4.4. •Late or Additional entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 4.5. •Teams will forfeit their entry fee if an entry is withdrawn within 7 days of the start of the event.

5. Eligibility

- 5.1. •The number of crew, including helm, is between 4 Crew, including Helm>>> and 6 Crew, including Helm>>>. There are no weight limits.
- 5.2. Teams will compete using a team name, this can be a club, class association, school, university, or a name that has relevance to the team.

5.3. •Gender Requirements:

(a) There are no gender requirements for this event. Crews should be aware of the requirements of invitation to enter the Series Final.

5.4. •Special Event Requirements

(a) There are no additional requirements.

5.5. •All crew under 18 years of age must provide a completed parent/guardian consent form at Registration on 15th February

6. Event Format and Schedule

6.1. •Registration will be on 15th February from 9am at the John Merricks building

6.2. •A briefing for competitors will be held at 9.30am in the club wetbar at the east end of the main clubhouse

6.3. •The first warning signal will not be before 10.00am

6.4. •On the final day of racing, it is anticipated that races won't be started after 15.30pm

7. Scoring

7.1. •Races will be scored using a High Point System as defined in the SI's. There will be no discards.

8. Sailing Instructions

8.1. •Sailing Instructions will be available at registration and will be posted on the online official noticeboard located at <https://events.ksail.co.uk.2025/BKLRutlandWinter/> and copies may also be displayed in the John Merricks building.

9. •Damage

9.1. By entering, Teams agree to be bound by the damage requirements as found in NoR Attachment X.

(a) A damage deposit for £350 is required at registration and before a team may sail. When a team is assessed as liable for damage, it may be required to restore the deposit to the original value before the team may sail another event boat.

(b) Damage costs attributed to competitors generally or to an unidentified team will be attributed equally between all teams.

10. •Prizes and Onward Qualification

10.1. Prizes and mementos will be awarded to the three highest ranked Crews.

10.2. Additional trophies and prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.

10.3. Qualification to the Series Final

(a) The highest ranked team where all crew are in full time education, aged under 25 and the skipper is over 15 on 1st January 2025 will receive invitation to the Series Final.

(b) Additionally, the two highest ranked teams that meet the Series Final entry requirements, will receive invitations to enter the Series Final

(c) Invitations to the Series Final shall be accepted within 28 days of the end of the relevant qualification event. Invitations not accepted by this time will be assumed to have been declined and the invitation will be issued to the next ranked team from the same qualification event.

10.4. Additional invitations for wildcard entries to the Series Final may be issued at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority of the Series Final.

11. •Advertising and Sponsorship

- 11.1. •Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.
- 11.2. •The organising authority may provide bibs that competitors are required to wear as permitted by the World Sailing Advertising Code. These will be available at Registration on 15th February

12. •Support Boats

- 12.1. Support boats will only be allowed at the discretion of the OA and shall be clearly marked to identify the club they are supporting. Requests to launch must be made to the OA by the entry deadline for the event.

13. •Media, Data Protection and Privacy Statement

- 13.1. When required, supplied media personnel, equipment or dummies shall be carried on board while racing.
- 13.2. Any member of a Crew may be required to wear provided devices that may record, transmit or provide two way communication and; will make themselves available for interviews when requested by OA.
- 13.3. Competitors shall not interfere with the normal working of supplied media equipment.
- 13.4. The personal information you provide to the Organising Authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event and may be shared with the British Keelboat League and other third party organisations; a list of whom may be obtained by contacting the Organising Authority. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the Organising Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.
- 13.5. By participating in this event competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make use and show at their discretion any photography, audio and video recordings and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue until their final departure, without compensation.

14. •Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

- 14.1. By taking part in the event, every competitor agrees and acknowledges that:
 - (a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event;
 - (b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
 - (c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
 - (d) the provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
 - (e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
 - (f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
 - (g) It is their responsibility to ensure that they are familiar with the type of boat used, and the supplied equipment and are suitably experienced with its operation.
 - (h) It is their responsibility for ensuring all supplied equipment is carried on board.
 - (i) They are fit to sail and that they believe the boat and crew are capable of competing in the anticipated conditions.

15. •Cancellation Policy

Should the event be cancelled, the OA will attempt to rearrange, if this is not possible a refund will be issued to effected entries less any expenses already incurred.
