The Organising Authority (OA) is the University of Bristol Sailing Club, Royal Southern Yacht Club, Royal Thames Yacht Club in conjunction with BKL.

1. Introduction

- 1.1. The British Keelboat League is a nationwide competition leading to the Sailing Champions League.
- 1.2. The David Haw Memorial Trophy will take place between 22nd and 23rd August 2026 at Royal Southern Yacht Club, Rope Walk, Hamble-le-Rice, Southampton SO31 4HB.
- 1.3. This qualifying event forms part of the British Keelboat League Series 2026. The competition is open to Teams or Clubs to compete in qualifying events for invitation to the Series Final.
- 1.4. The Event will be sailed in J/70 type keelboats supplied by the Organising Authority.
- 1.5. There will be more Teams than boats at each event with each Team being scheduled to race in a selection of races against as many different Teams as equitably possible.

- 1.8. The RYA Racing Charter is in effect and competitors are expected to sail in compliance with it. The Charter can be found at the front of the RYA edition of the Racing Rules of Sailing (the yellow pages after the definitions), or on the RYA website at <https://www.rya.org.uk/racing/rules/rya-racing-charter/>.

2. Rules

- 2.1. The event will be governed by the Rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and local byelaws.
- 2.2. Races will be umpired; rule changes can be found in Appendix UF - British Keelboat League Edition.
- 2.3. RRS 40.1 (Personal Floatation Devices) applies at all times whilst sailing or transferring between boats, except whilst on an anchored Hotel Vessel.

3. Event Details

4. Entry

- 4.1. The Entry fee shall be £500 before 2359 on the 24th of July 2026, and £530 after this date.
- 4.2. Entries and Entry Fee payment should be made online using the University of Bristol Student's Union website available at <https://www.bristolsu.org.uk/groups/university-of-bristol-sailing-club-0225/events>, by no later than 2359 on 7th of August 2026.
- 4.3. A minimum of 6 entries and a maximum of 12 entries will be accepted on a first come first served basis. Entries will be allocated solely at the discretion of the organising authority.
- 4.4. Late or Additional entries may be accepted at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority.
- 4.5. Teams will forfeit their entry fee if an entry is withdrawn after the entry deadline.

5. Eligibility

- 5.1. The number of crew, including helm, is between 4 and 5. There are no weight limits.
- 5.2. All crew under 18 years of age must provide a completed parent/guardian consent form at registration.
- 5.3. Teams will compete using a team name, this can be a club, class association, school, university, or a name that has relevance to the team.
- 5.4. There are no gender requirements for this event. Crews should be aware of the requirements of invitation to enter the Series Final.

6. Event Format and Schedule

- 6.1. Registration will be on the 22nd of August between 0800 and 0900 at the Royal Southern Yacht Club.
- 6.2. A briefing for competitors will be held at on the 22nd of August at 0900 at the Royal Southern Yacht Club.
- 6.3. The first warning signal will not be before 1100.
- 6.4. On the final day of racing, it is anticipated that races won't be started after 1500.

7. Scoring

- 7.1. Races will be scored using a High Point System as defined in the SI's. There will be no

discards. 8. Sailing Instructions

- 8.1. Sailing Instructions will be available at registration and posted on the online official notice board which is located at <https://events.ksail.co.uk/2026/BKLUoB/>.

9. Damage

- 9.1. By entering, Teams agree to be bound by the damage requirements as found in NoR Attachment X. (a) A damage deposit is not required before racing; however, each boat is liable for up to £1000 of associated costs due to damage because of any one incident (this includes boats, sails, equipment, and property). When a team is assessed as liable for damage, it may be required to restore the deposit to the original value before the team may sail another event boat.
(b) Damage costs attributed to competitors generally or to an unidentified team will be attributed equally between all teams.

10. Prizes and Onward Qualification

- 10.1. The David Haw Memorial Trophy will be awarded to the highest ranked team.
- 10.2. Additional trophies and prizes may be awarded at the discretion of the OA.
- 10.3. Qualification to the Series Final
 - (a) The highest ranked team where all crew are in full time education, aged under 25 and the skipper is over 15 on 1st January 2026 will receive invitation to the Series Final.
 - (b) Additionally, the two highest ranked teams that meet the Series Final entry requirements, will receive invitations to enter the Series Final
 - (c) Invitations to the Series Final shall be accepted within 28 days of the end of the relevant qualification event. Invitations not accepted by this time will be assumed to have been declined and the invitation will be issued to the next ranked team from the same qualification event.
- 10.4. Additional invitations for wildcard entries to the Series Final may be issued at the sole discretion of the Organising Authority of the Series Final.

11. Advertising and Sponsorship

12. Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.
13. The organising authority may provide bibs that competitors are required to wear as permitted by the World Sailing Advertising Code.

14. Support Boats

- 14.1. Support boats will only be allowed at the discretion of the OA and shall be clearly marked to identify the club they are supporting. Requests to launch must be made to the OA by the entry deadline for the event.

15. Media, Data Protection and Privacy Statement

- 15.1. When required, supplied media personnel, equipment or dummies shall be carried on board while racing.
- 15.2. Any member of a Crew may be required to wear provided devices that may record, transmit or provide two-way communication and; will make themselves available for interviews when requested by OA.
- 15.3. Competitors shall not interfere with the normal working of supplied media equipment.
- 15.4. The personal information you provide to the Organising Authority will be used to facilitate your participation in the event and may be shared with the British Keelboat League and other third-party organisations; a list of whom may be obtained by contacting the Organising Authority. If you have agreed to be bound by the Racing Rules of Sailing and the other rules that govern the event (the rules), the legal basis for processing that personal information is contract. If you are not bound by the rules, the legal basis for processing that personal information is legitimate interest. Your personal information will be stored and used in accordance with the Organising Authority's privacy policy. When required by the rules, personal information may be shared with the RYA, your national authority

and/or World Sailing. The results of the event and the outcome of any hearing or appeal may be published.

15.5. By participating in this event competitors automatically grant to the Organising Authority the right in perpetuity to make use and show at their discretion any photography, audio and video recordings and other reproductions of them made at the venue or on the water from the time of their arrival at the venue until their final departure, without compensation.

16. Risk Statement

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk.

16.1. By taking part in the event, every competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (a) they are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event; (b) they are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (c) they accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions;
- (d) the provision of a race management team, patrol boats, umpires and other officials and volunteers by the event organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (e) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.
- (f) It is their responsibility to familiarise themselves with any risks specific to this venue or this event drawn to their attention in any rules and information produced for the venue or event and to attend any safety briefing held for the event.
- (g) It is their responsibility to ensure that they are familiar with the type of boat used, and the supplied equipment and are suitably experienced with its operation.
- (h) It is their responsibility for ensuring all supplied equipment is carried on board.
- (i) They are fit to sail and that they believe the boat and crew are capable of competing in the anticipated conditions.

17. Cancellation Policy

17.1. Refunds will be issued as follows:

- (a) If entry is withdrawn by the competitor before the entry deadline, a full refund (less a £50 admin fee) will be issued.
- (b) If entry is withdrawn by the competitor after the entry deadline, no refund will be issued. (c) If entry is withdrawn by the Organising Authority, or if the Organising Authority decide in advance not to run the event, a full refund will be issued.
